The highest award any Commandant can awward to their membership is a Distinguished Citizen Medal. It is earned by a Detachment member who has demonstrated by leadership and performance an outstanding contribution to the Detachment, Marine Corps League, and the Community. That recipient's conduct must also reflect favorably and this member must bring credit the Detachment, Marine Corps League, and the United States Marine Corps. There are three levels of this award: Bronze - which can be issued by a Detachment Commandant or higher, a Silver - which can be issued by a Department Commandant or higher, and the Gold - which can be issued by the National Commandant alone. In the past, the Detachment members have planned the hike, Brok Timpa (the original hike coordinator for Baton Rouge and Commandant James Roy). Now the hike is being let by Steven Babin an Army Veteran who has also become an Associate Member of the Choctaw Detachment.

The Silkies Hike is Irreverent Warriors' annual large event to "Bring veterans together using humor and camaraderie to improve mental health and prevent veteran suicide." This mostly caters to the younger veterans as they are more fit to hike, however there is no shortage of volunteers needed and the hike is also very slow paced and makes frequent stops to provide time for the participants to rest and bond with one another. 

Recruit New Members

One of the main missions of any Detachment is recruiting and retention. You can help our Detachment grow by bringing in new members or even bringing back members who have fallen to inactive status. The Junior Vice Commandant of the Detachment is in charge of the Membership Committee. They can help you learn how to sign up and new member and what the requirements are. They will have pamphlets and applications so that you can go out and recruit members on your own, you can even join the Membership Committee to help the Detachment with recruiting plans. Every Detachment must recruit to survive.

Members who in any combination recruit new members or reinstate members who have fallen to the inactive roster of 5 or more in a year become eligible to receive a Detachment Recruiting Ribbon. The member with the most will become Detachment Recruiter of the Year and be submitted for Department and National Recruiter of the Year.

Additionally, any members who achieves 5 or more will have their name will be submitted to National MCL and will receive a citation from the National Jr. Vice Commandant. If a member reaches 25-49 members in a given year they will receive a National Recruiter Medal - Bronze and a Distinguished Service Award. Members recruiting 50 or more members in a given year will receive the National Recruiter Medal - Silver and the Distinguished Service Medal. The top recruiter of the Year will receive the National Recruiter Medal - Gold, a plaque, and the Distinguished Service Medal. All National Awards will be read aloud during the awards ceremony at the National Conference.




Military Order of the Devil Dogs - Louisiana Pack
