Recruit New Members

One of the main missions of any Detachment is recruiting and retention. You can help our Detachment grow by bringing in new members or even bringing back members who have fallen to inactive status. The Junior Vice Commandant of the Detachment is in charge of the Membership Committee. They can help you learn how to sign up and new member and what the requirements are. They will have pamphlets and applications so that you can go out and recruit members on your own, you can even join the Membership Committee to help the Detachment with recruiting plans. Every Detachment must recruit to survive.

Additionally, any members who achieves 5 or more will have their name will be submitted to National MCL and will receive a citation from the National Jr. Vice Commandant. If a member reaches 25-49 members in a given year they will receive a National Recruiter Medal - Bronze and a Distinguished Service Award. Members recruiting 50 or more members in a given year will receive the National Recruiter Medal - Silver and the Distinguished Service Medal. The top recruiter of the Year will receive the National Recruiter Medal - Gold, a plaque, and the Distinguished Service Medal. All National Awards will be read aloud during the awards ceremony at the National Conference.

Department News

The Department Fall Staff Meeting took place on 23 October 2021, here in Baton Rouge, LA at the VFW Zachary Taylor Post 13214 S. Choctaw Dr. The staff meeting was attended by 36 members of the Department including most of the Department Staff. During the staff meeting Department Commandant, Glenn Suire, read correspondence from SE Div NVC Jerry Holt and spoke about Disaster Relief efforts. Department SVC, James Roy, gave a report on the actions he has been doing including constructing some SOPs and databases for the Department. Dept JVC, Allen Leblanc, spoke about Hurricane Ida recovery and the possible recovery of the old Bayou Detachment under a new charter.

A new proposal was made to raise Department dues from \$4 to \$10. This proposal passed by a vote of 5 Detachments to 4 and will take effect on 1 September 2022 renewal date. There was also a call for Detachments to support the upcoming Division Conference.


